# FFT Attendance Tracker - Guidance for Local Authorities

#### Overview

FFT's Attendance Tracker allows you to analyse and track your Local Authority's and schools' attendance data. Most importantly, it enables you to compare and monitor key attendance metrics against the national picture on a week-by-week basis. This guidance document will take you through all the key features and reports of the system.


## Important - before you get started

Please read through the guidance document before starting to use the system and in particular the following points:


- 1. We continue to update and improve the site on a regular basis. You should therefore expect to see changes to reports or even new reports appearing from time to time.

#### How to access Attendance Tracker


- 1. Log into your Aspire homepage using your regular Aspire username and password
- 2. On the right hand side you will see an overview of your local authority's attendance data for the year compared to the national figure for the selected phase (primary or secondary).




3. To access more detailed reports for your local authority please follow the link at the top of the homepage:



4. The link will take you to the 'All Schools: Attendance Summary' report for the phase you have selected. Use the filters on the report to interrogate the data further and the tabs at the top to look at different reports.




Please note that you can also view your LA's '360' report via the tab shown above OR the navigation panel on the left hand side.



# Attendance Tracker reporting

#### Overview

When you click on the primary or secondary link the 'All Schools: Attendance Summary' report for the selected phase will appear. There are 8 reports in total, including this one. Click on the **tabs** to move from one report to another.



#### **Terms**

Each report is split into half-terms with the current half-term shown by default. You can change to another half-term simply by clicking the 'Term' filter.

#### Data collection

Data is collected daily from each school's MIS via Aspire Data Exchange. Attendance Tracker reports are then refreshed on a weekly basis with the previous week's data available each Wednesday.

#### Other filters

You will also find a number of other filters available on the Group reports based on pupil context data. These include:


- Year Group
- Gender
- FSM6
- SEND

You can use single filters or combinations of filters to change the attendance data shown on the reports. The national comparator will reflect the filters selected.

All of the codes that are processed in Attendance Tracker reflect the DFE's current guidance on attendance which is found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>


	The 360 report summarises the key year to date attendance data for the LA, pupil groups and year groups.
360 Report	Data can also be viewed for the latest week. Persistent absence is also shown at a whole LA, pupil group and individual year group level. All data is compared to national and regional figures. 360 reports for individual schools or groups of schools can be viewed via a drop-down selector.
All Schools: Attendance Summary	This report shows the cumulative, year to date attendance figure for all schools within the LA that are receiving attendance reports. The data can be filtered by year group, gender, FSM6 and SEND. The school with the highest attendance is displayed at the top of the chart, but this can be reversed to show lowest first. Lines show the LA and FFT national average figures.
All Schools: Weekly Attendance	This report allows you to see all schools within the LA that are receiving attendance reports. Cumulative and weekly figures are shown. The school figure is compared to the FFT national figure for the same week and indicates if this attendance is above or below the national figure. The authorised and unauthorised absence figures are then broken down into the separate aspects of authorised absence and unauthorised absence. The report can be shown for all year groups or individual year groups. The school data can be filtered by gender, FSM6 and SEND. Individual schools and groups of schools can be selected or de-selected using a drop-down option.




# Year Groups

Individual schools and groups of schools can be selected or de-selected using a drop-down option.




# **Pupil Groups**

This report allows you to see the breakdown of attendance for different pupil groups (gender, SEND & FSM6) across the LA and indicates if this attendance is above or below the same pupil group nationally. Cumulative and weekly figures are shown. Data is shown for the current half-term, but can be changed using the 'Term' drop down. The report can be shown for all year groups or individual year groups. Individual schools and groups of schools can be selected or de-selected using a drop-down option.



## Absence

This report shows the cumulative weekly absence for the LA, as well as a breakdown of weekly absence across the LA. Absence is broken down by overall, authorised, and unauthorised. The authorised and unauthorised absence figures are then broken down into the separate aspects of authorised absence and unauthorised absence. The report can be shown for all year groups or individual year groups. The school data can be filtered by gender, FSM6 and SEND. Individual schools and groups of schools can be selected or de-selected using a drop-down option.



## Attendance Tracker - Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Are attendance figures shown to one decimal place?
  - Yes, on the 'Attendance summary' and 'Absence' reports. On the 'Year groups' and 'Pupil groups' reports figures are shown to the nearest whole percentage, but hovering over any figure on these reports will show a decimalised percentage.
- 2. Do the colours on the reports indicate statistical significance'?
  - O No, the depth of the colour indicates the difference between the LA and national figures. There are three shades of green and red; the lightest shade is used when the LA figure differs from the national figure by 1-1.99%, the middle shade is used when the difference is between 2-3.99% and the darkest shows differences of 4% or greater. No colour indicates a difference of less than 1%.
- 3. When are reports updated?
  - We aim to release reports every Wednesday, with data shown to the end of the previous week.
- 4. Our schools have slightly different term dates to the majority of other English schools, will this be shown in the reports?
  - Yes, the attendance reports will reflect your schools' term dates.
- 5. Why is there no 'National' line for some weeks?
  - The only time we don't show a national line on the reports is if there is insufficient data to justify it. This is generally if one or a smaller group of areas start or finish the term at different times to the vast majority of others.
- 6. Why aren't Years 12 and 13 included?
  - Our Attendance Tracker records session attendance. Many Post 16 schools and colleges don't require students to be in every morning and afternoon so attendance figures might not reflect the overall attendance of the year group(s).
- 7. Why are some figures in Attendance Tracker different to our schools' MIS?
  - We collect attendance data for the previous 5 days, so if a school has made retrospective attendance changes on their MIS system beyond this time these changes will not be immediately reflected in our reports. Our reports are updated every week whereas a school's MIS can show 'live' figures, which will show the instant impact of any amendments to codes. Schools will need to contact us to re-extract their data. This will bring any retrospective changes into the reports. The 'Data Check' report (available to schools) shows the marks that we have.
